

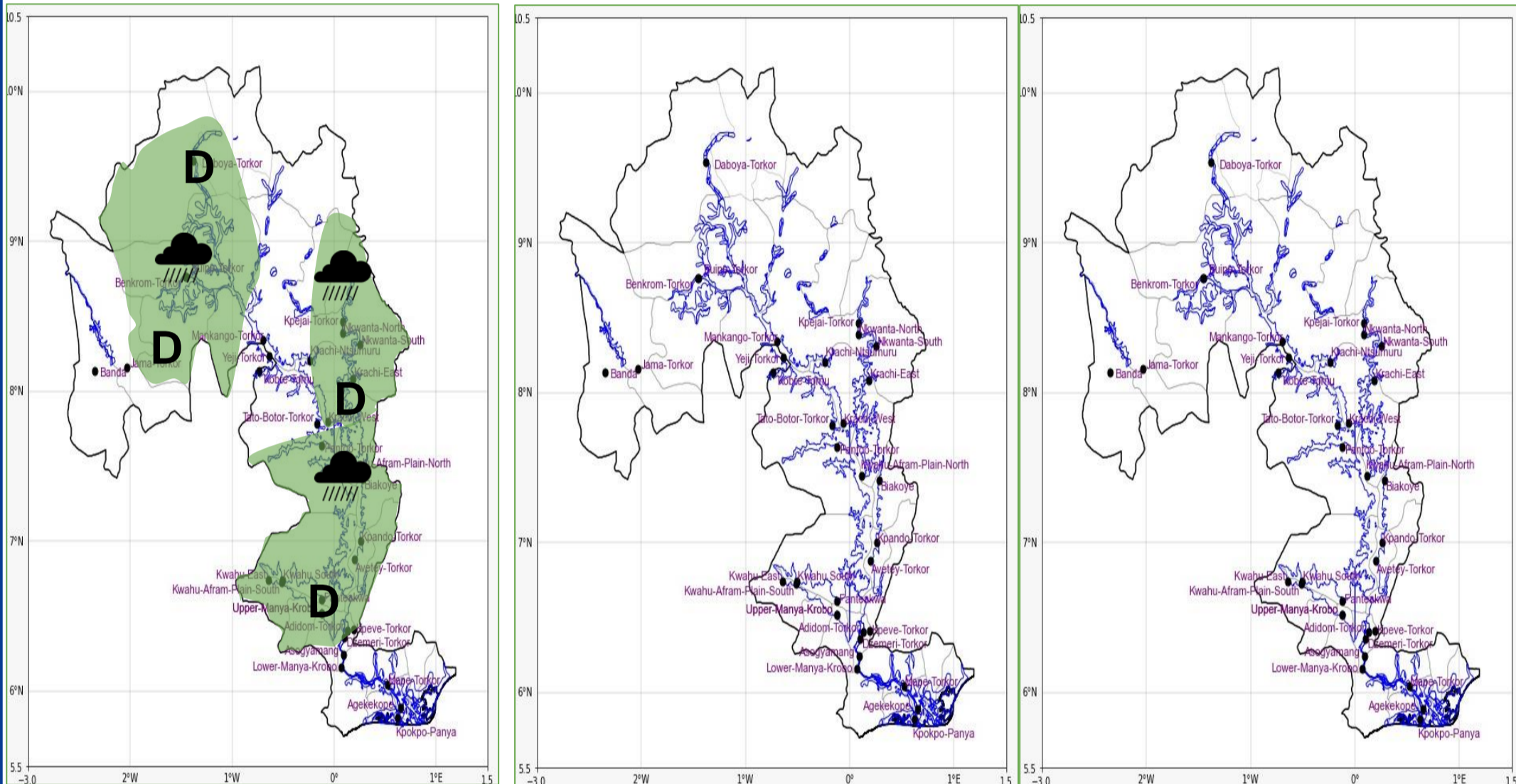


INLAND WATER IMPACT-BASED FORECAST

WEATHER SUMMARY

Variably cloudy conditions will prevail over most parts of the lake tonight through to the end of the forecast period, with isolated thunderstorms and rain affecting areas in the northern, middle, and southern sectors in the evening. Mist is expected to reduce visibility over the hilly and forested zones during the early hours of the morning.
