

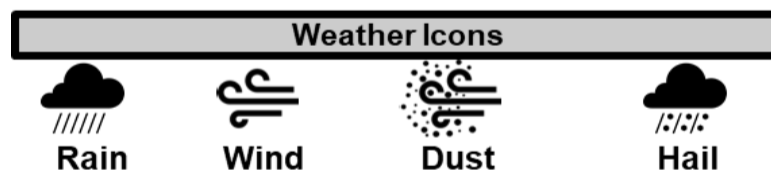
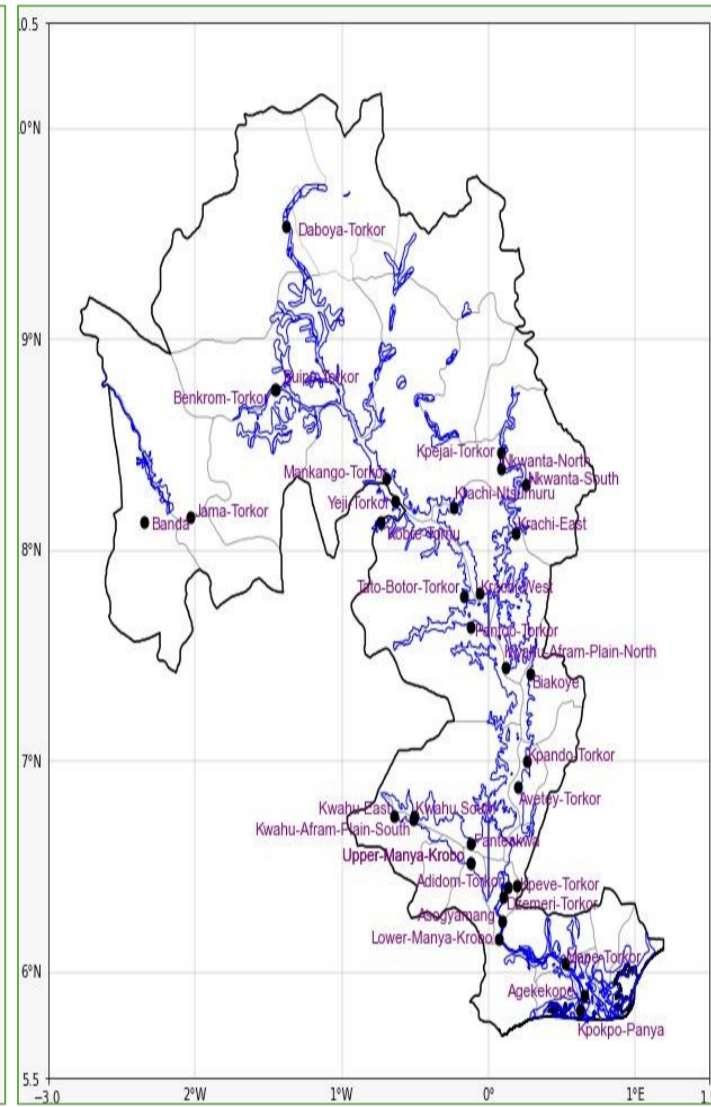
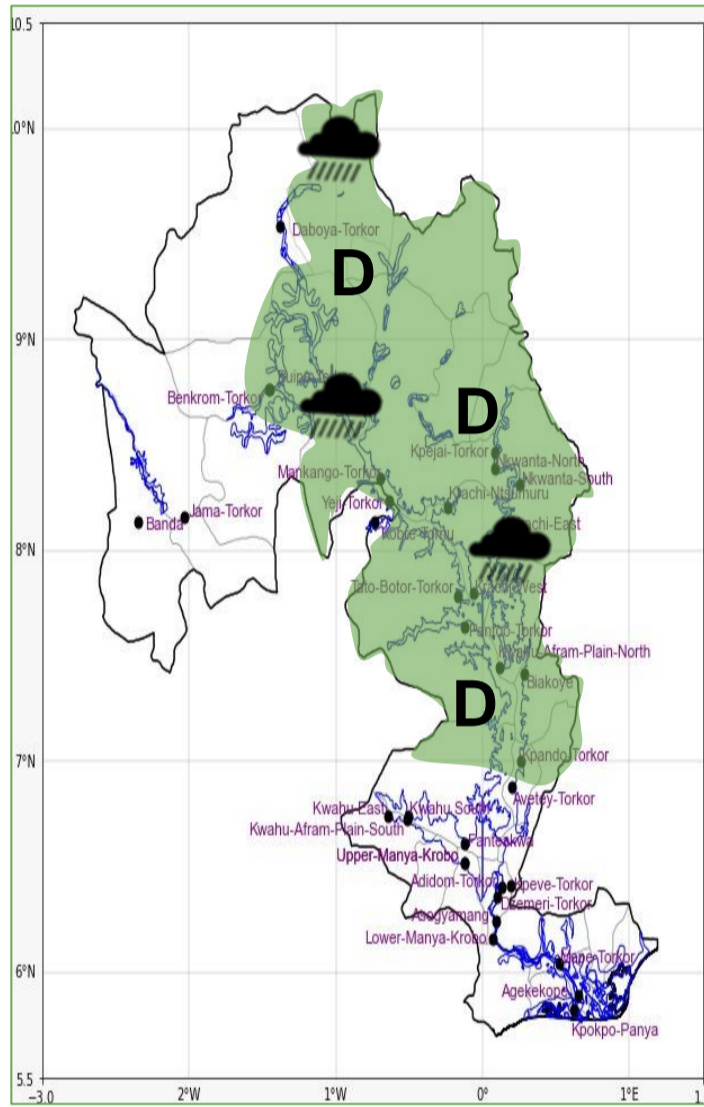
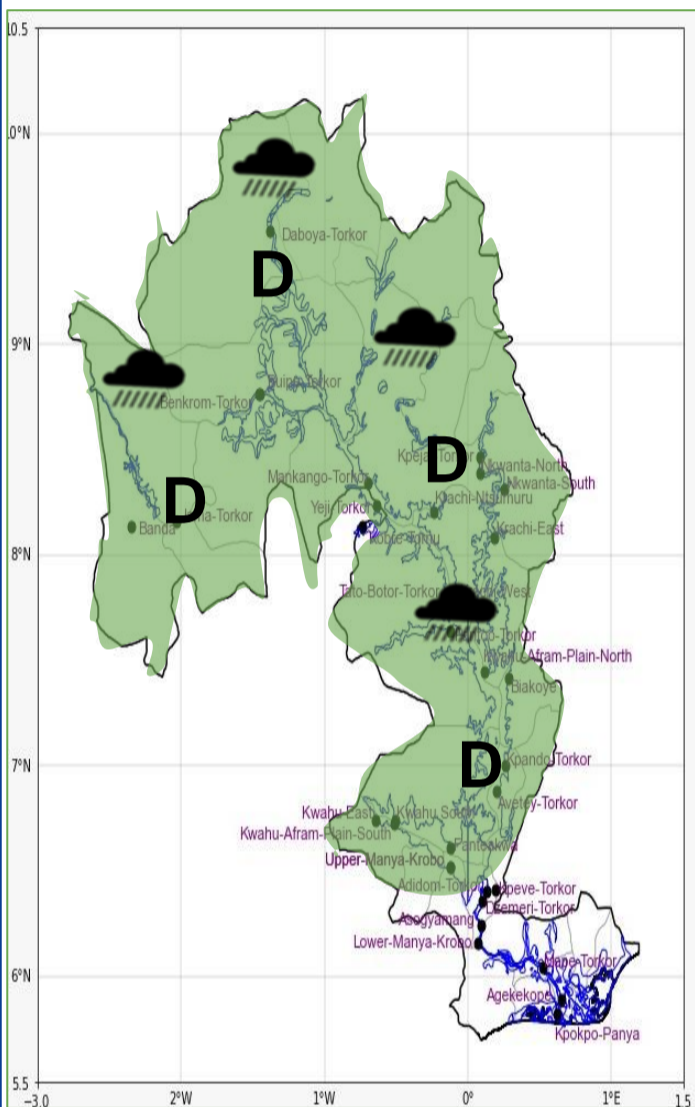


INLAND WATER IMPACT-BASED FORECAST

WEATHER SUMMARY

Persistent cloud cover over the lake area is expected to produce light to moderate rainfall, accompanied by thunder and gusty winds, with a 40% chance, particularly across the northern sector from the evening through to tomorrow morning. The southern sector will remain mostly cloudy throughout the period. Reduced visibility is likely in the early morning due to dense cloud cover; therefore, sailors are advised to exercise caution.
