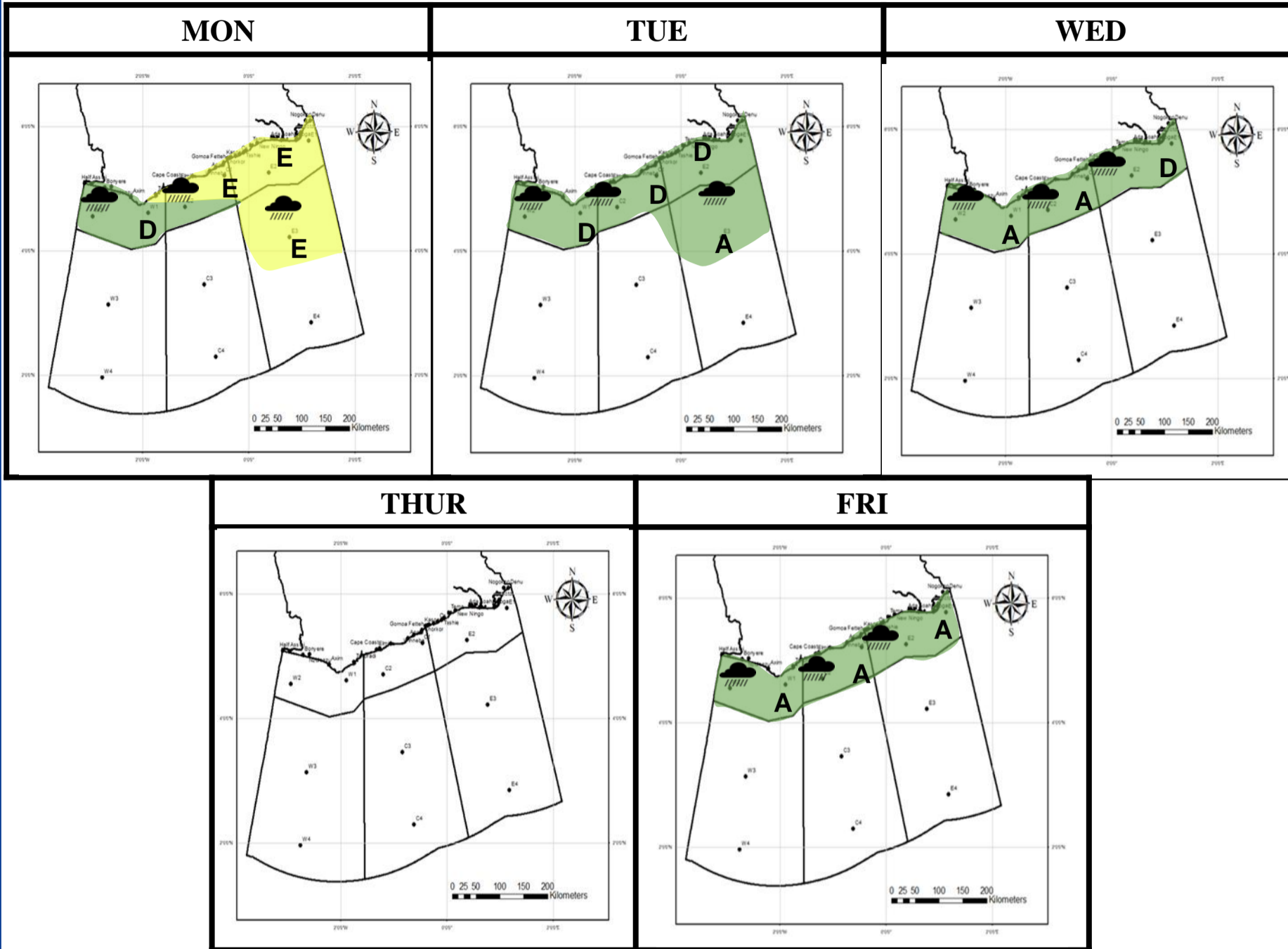

WEATHER SUMMARY

The nation's maritime space is expected to experience predominantly cloudy weather conditions throughout the forecast period. Isolated rain of varying intensities and thunderstorms, accompanied by moderate to strong winds, are anticipated to affect onshore and some offshore areas during the week. The state of the sea is expected to remain rough throughout the week.
