Summary

Week 1:

Rainfall: Below normal rainfall is expected in most parts of the country with the exception of the western portions of the Southern sector and areas in the Upper parts of the Northern sector which are likely to record above normal rainfall.

Temperature: Above normal temperatures are expected across the entire country.

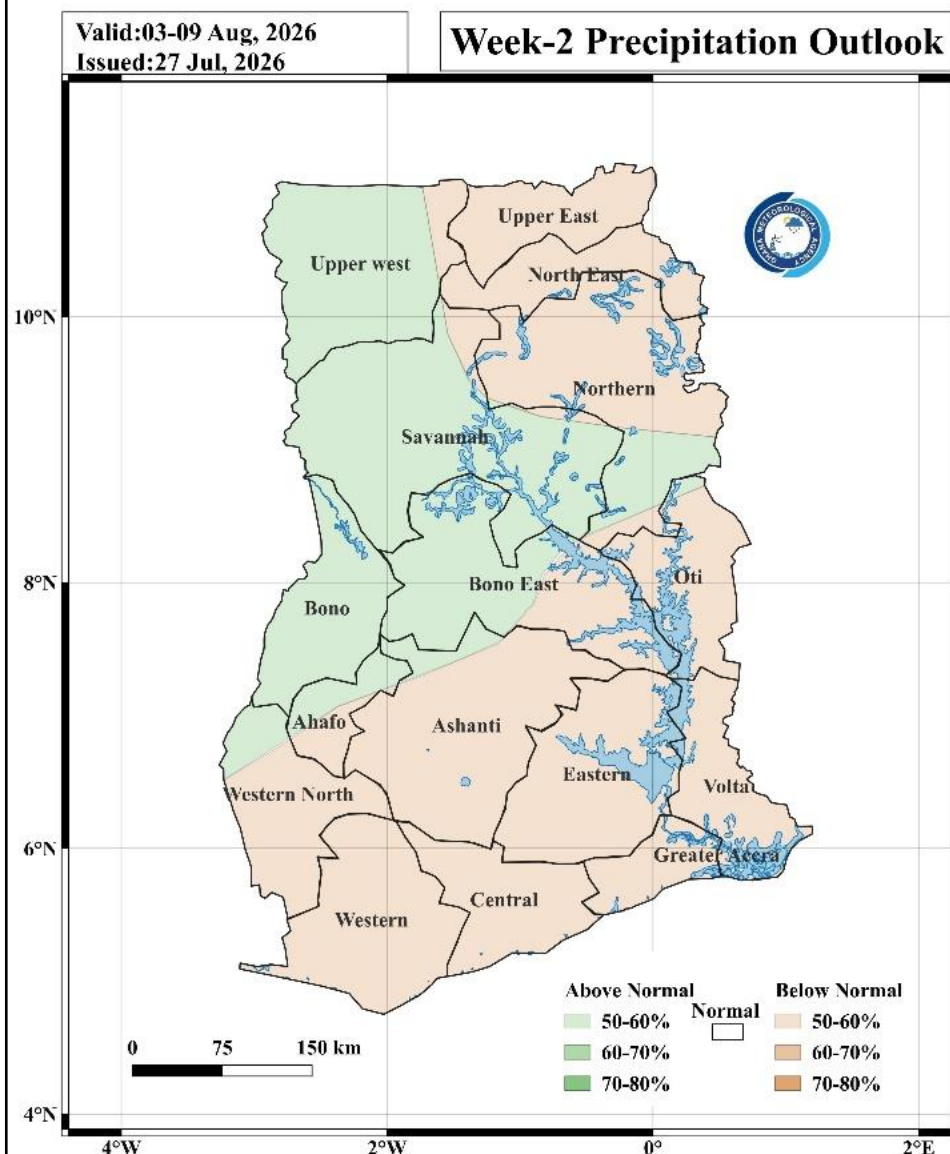

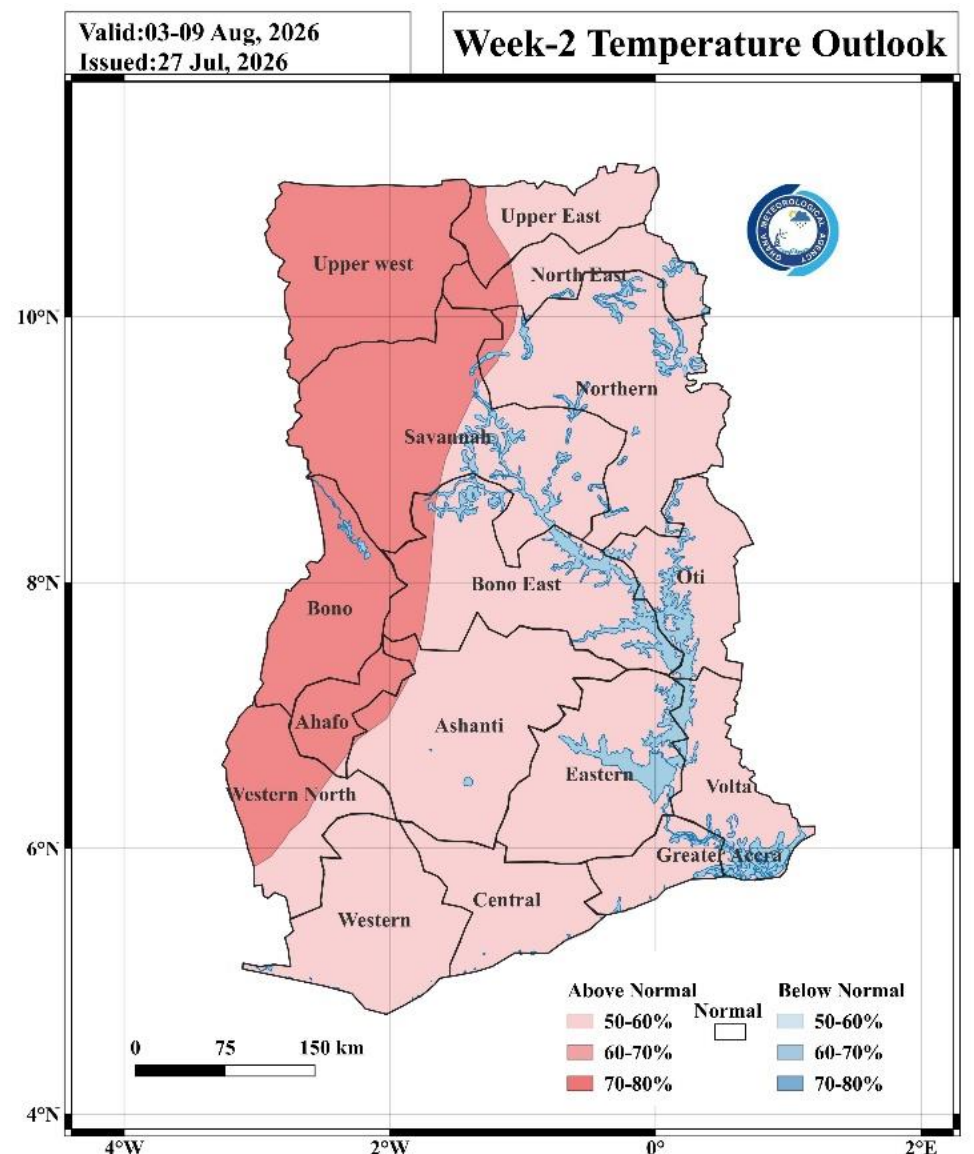

Summary

Week 2:

Rainfall: Below-normal rainfall is expected in the Southern sector, the eastern parts of the Transition zone and the Northern sector. The rest of the country is expected to record above normal rainfall.

Temperature: Generally, the country is expected to record above normal temperatures.



SUB-SEASONAL TO SEASONAL FORECAST IN GHANA

Advisory

- For the 1st week, the western portions of the Southern sector and areas in the Upper parts of the Northern sector are expected to have above normal rainfall. The public should take precautionary measures against possible flooding and waterlogging, particularly in low-lying and flood-prone areas. Individuals in areas expecting below normal rainfall are advised to prepare for reduced water availability and possible drier conditions.
- The country is expected to record above normal temperatures which call for adequate hydration and limited sun exposure during peak afternoon hours.
- As the period progresses into the 2nd week, below normal rainfall is expected in the Southern sector, and the eastern parts of the Transition zone and the Northern sector. Above normal temperatures will persist over the rest of the country – staying hydrated is advised.
- **The public is encouraged to stay informed by following daily weather updates from the Ghana Meteorological Agency.**
