Summary

Week 1:

Rainfall: Below normal rainfall is expected across most parts of the Southern sector and the Northern sector. The Transition zone and places in the Forest zone within the Southern sector are likely to record above normal rainfall. The East coast is expected to record normal conditions.

Temperature: Above normal temperatures are expected over the entire country.

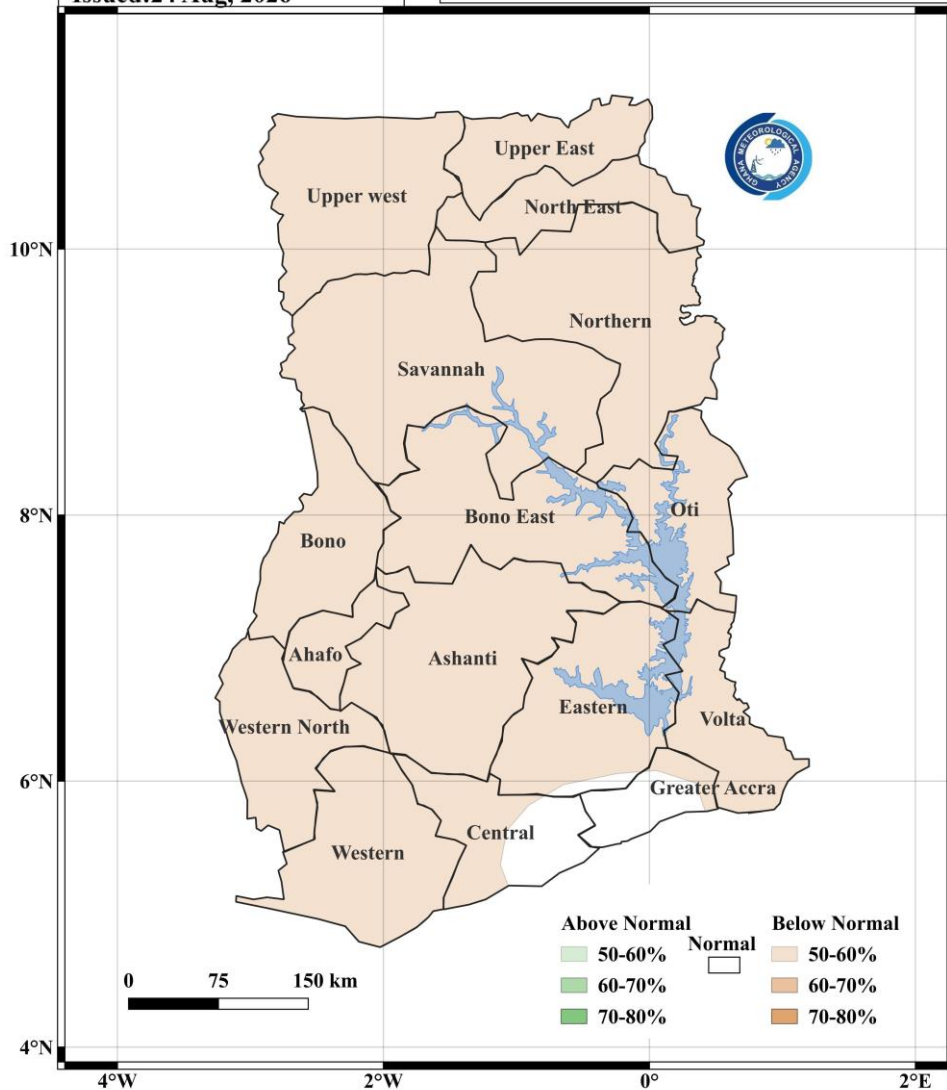

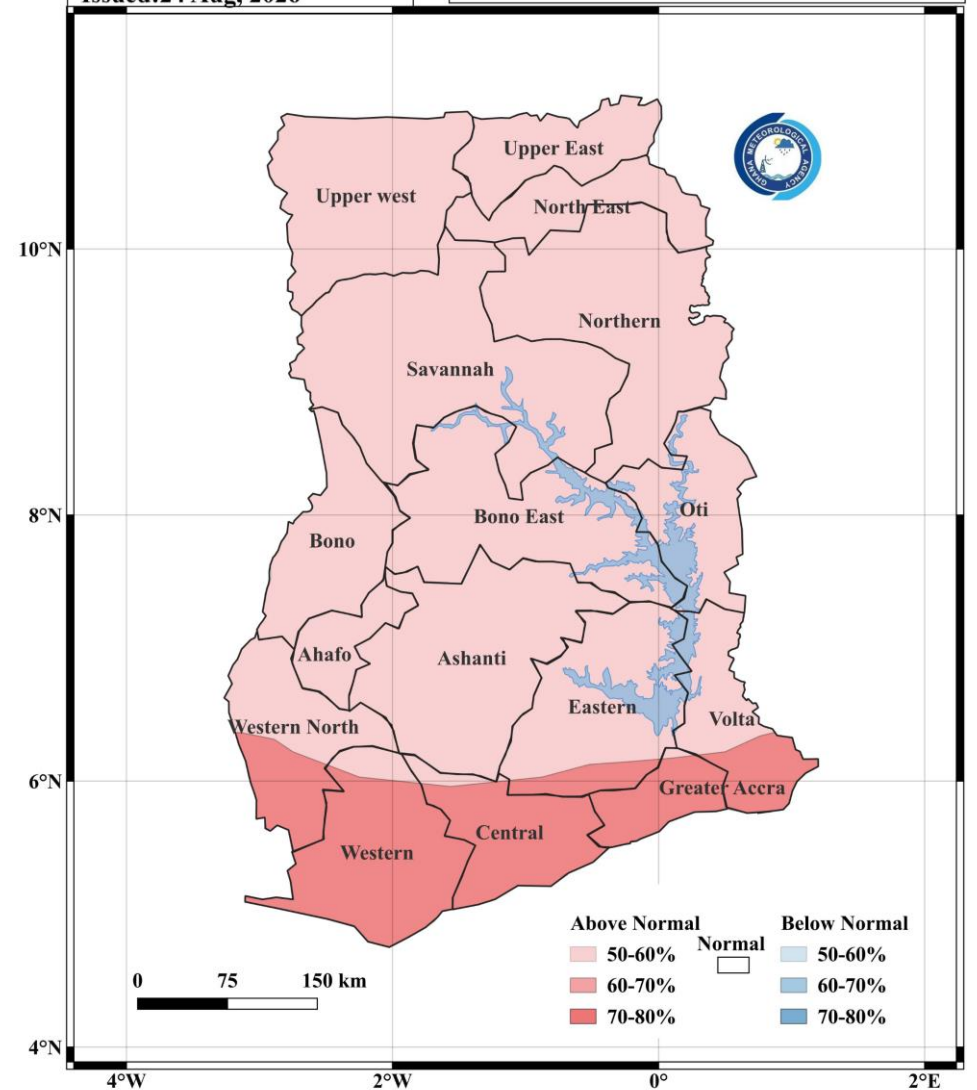

Summary

Week 2:

Rainfall: The country is expected to record below normal rainfall, with the exception of the East coast, which is likely to record normal conditions.

Temperature: Generally, the country is expected to record above normal temperatures.



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Advisory

- For the 1st week, below normal rainfall is expected across most parts of the Southern sector and the Northern sector. Individuals are advised to store water whenever it rains and ensure prudent use of available water. The Transition zone and places in the Forest zone within the Southern sector are likely to record above normal rainfall - Take precautionary measures against possible flooding and waterlogging, particularly in low-lying areas.
- The country is expected to record above normal temperatures, which calls for adequate hydration and limited sun exposure during peak afternoon hours.
- As the period progresses into the 2nd week, below normal rainfall is expected in the entire country. Above normal temperatures will persist over the rest of the country – staying hydrated is advised.
- **The public is encouraged to stay informed by following daily weather updates from the Ghana Meteorological Agency.**
