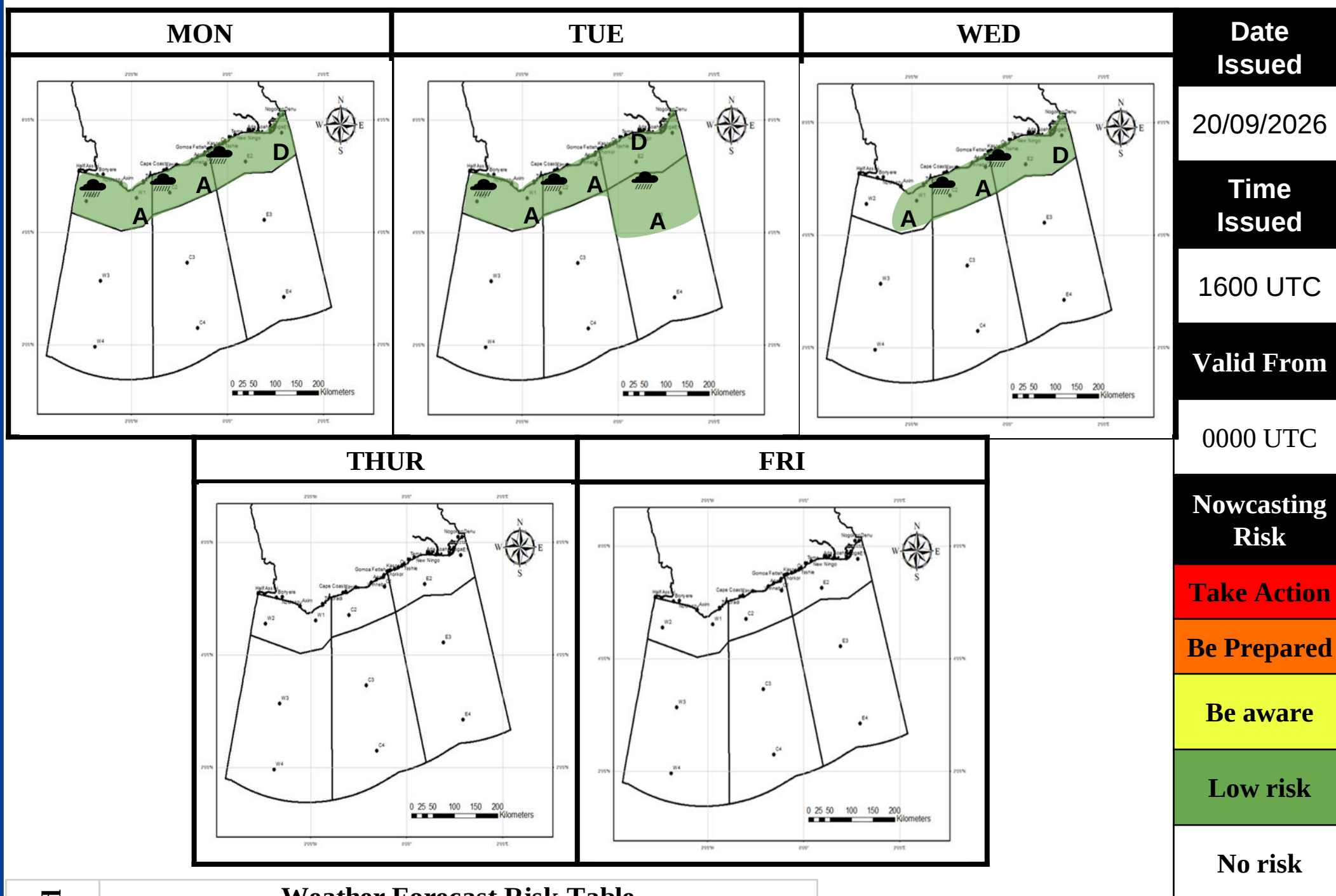


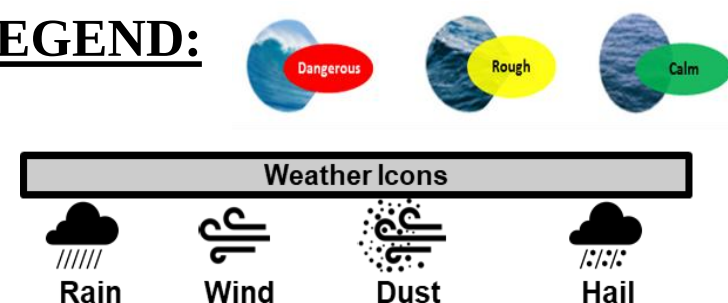

WEATHER SUMMARY

The maritime region is expected to remain predominantly cloudy throughout the week, with occasional periods of afternoon sunshine. However, there is a 30–40% chance of isolated slight rain and gusty winds along the coastline and over some offshore areas during the forecast period. The state of the sea is anticipated to remain rough from Monday to Thursday, with a gradual improvement to calm conditions by Friday.
