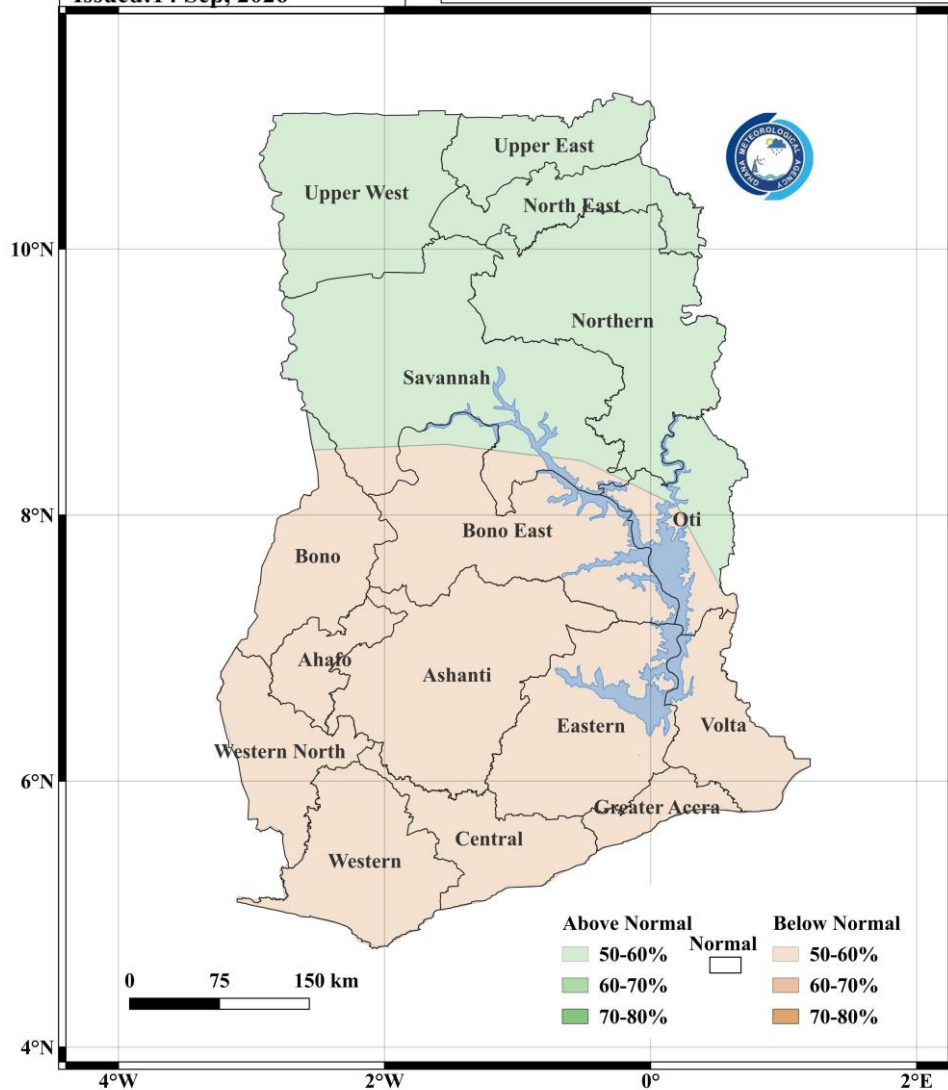

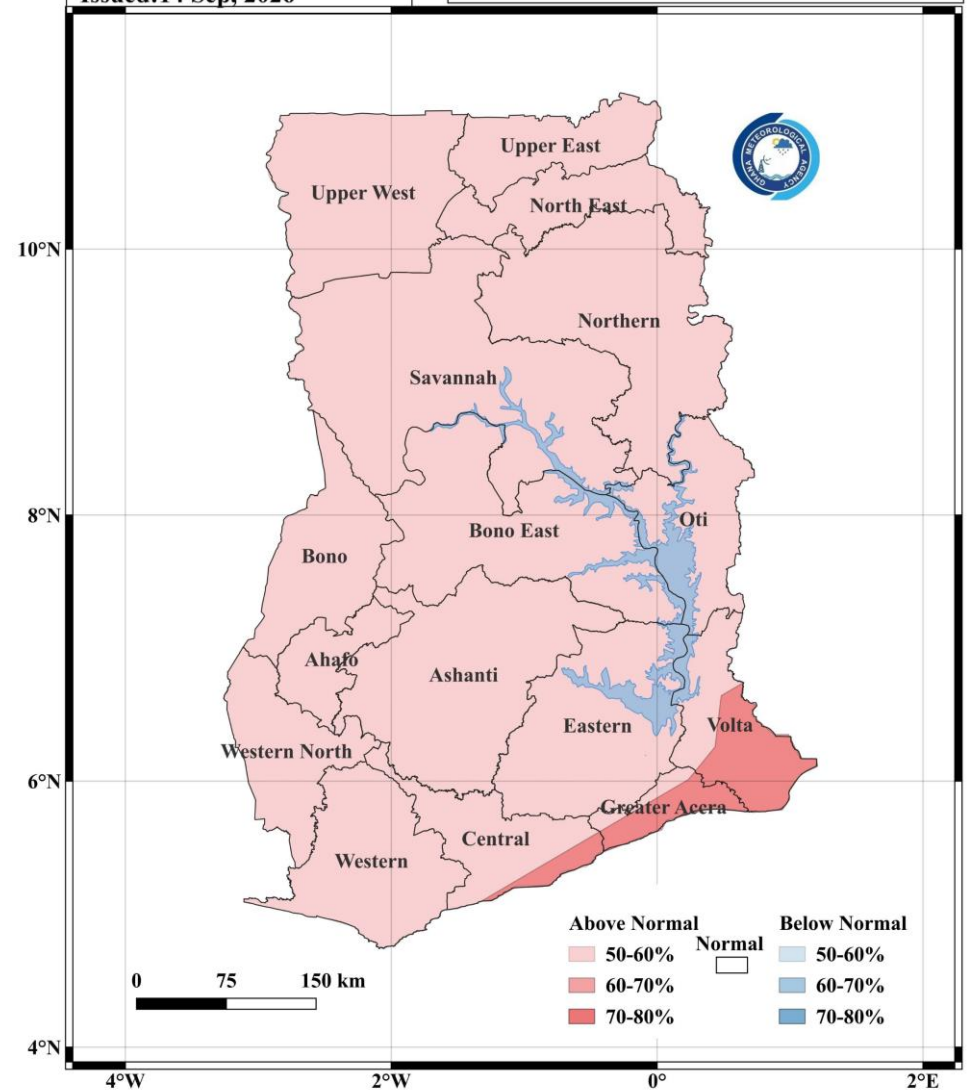

Summary

Week 2:

Rainfall: Above normal rainfall is expected in the Northern sector together with the upper parts of the Oti region, whereas below normal rainfall is expected in the Southern sector.

Temperature: The country is expected to experience above normal temperatures.



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Advisory

- For the 1st week, below normal rainfall is expected across the country. Individuals are advised to ensure prudent use of available water. Also, road users are advised to exercise caution on dusty roads, particularly where reduced visibility may occur.
- The country is expected to experience above-normal temperatures; therefore, adequate hydration is encouraged, and prolonged exposure to the sun during peak afternoon hours should be avoided.
- As the period progresses into the 2nd week, below normal rainfall is expected in the Southern sector of the country, except for the Northern sector together with the upper parts of the Oti region, which are likely to record above normal rainfall - Keep drainage channels, gutters, and culverts free from rubbish and other obstructions. Also, avoid staying near rivers, low-lying areas, and locations prone to flooding during rainfall.
- Above normal temperatures will persist across the country – staying hydrated is advised.
- **The public is encouraged to stay informed by following daily weather updates from the Ghana Meteorological Agency.**
