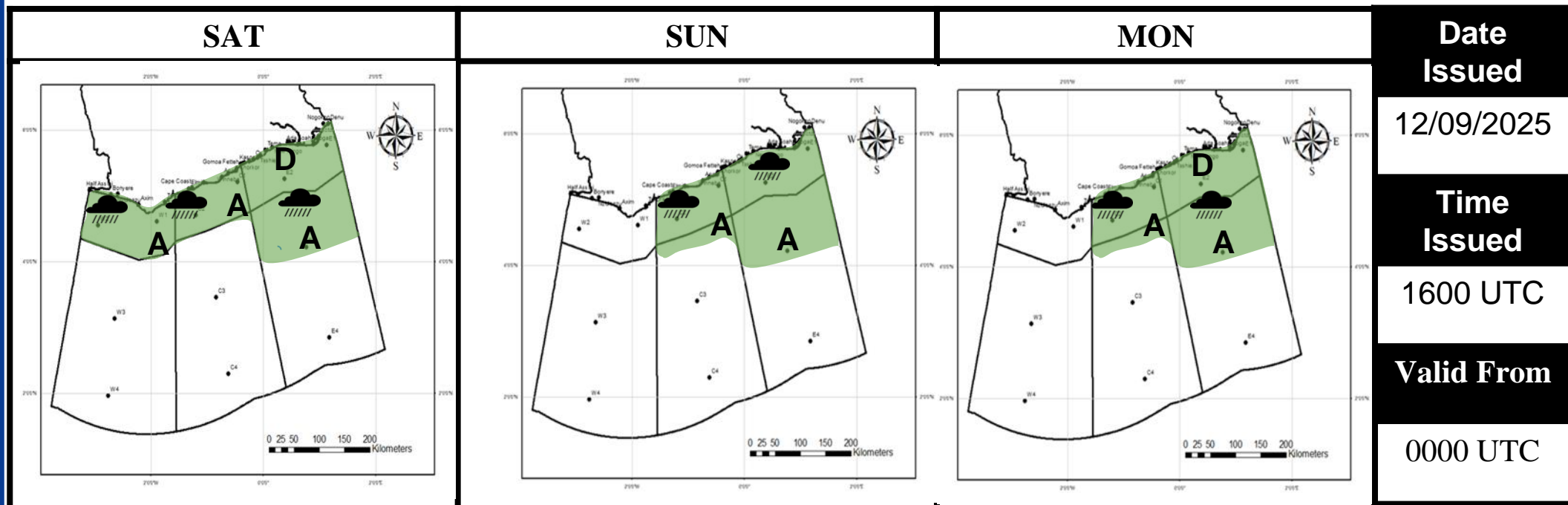

WEATHER SUMMARY

The country's maritime space is expected to experience predominantly cloudy weather conditions throughout this weekend, with brief periods of sunshine. There is, however, a 40% likelihood of isolated rain of varying intensities along the coastline and offshore areas.

The sea state is expected to remain rough throughout the forecast period, with strong winds anticipated, particularly on Saturday and Monday.
