

WEATHER SUMMARY

The marine space weather is expected to remain generally fair throughout the forecast period. However, offshore areas have a 40% chance of isolated rainfall, with possible rainfall along the western coasts toward the end of the period. Sunny spells will dominate most afternoons along the coastlines, while mornings and evenings will experience few to broken cloud cover. Early morning mist may reduce visibility but will gradually clear after sunrise.
